Working with members, partners and non-State Actors in Official Relationship with WHO, support WHO in the WHO Global Patient Safety Plan 2021-2030 and raise awareness in Health Minister and Legislators of Member States at the World Health Assembly of the evidence base, policy instruments and model patient charters and legislation that will achieve the objectives.
