I'm a tireless fighter who works to improve the quality of attention and care, accessibility and quality of life of people with diabetes, getting involved in the processes that make public policies, to transform them into solid, inclusive, equitable and effective policies for people with diabetes.

In 2001 I founded CUI.D.AR, a non-profit NGO that works for children, youth and adults living with diabetes to minimize the impact of this chronic condition on their lives.

I'm a Member of the National Diabetes Advisory Commission of the Ministry of Health of Argentina and of the Global Network "Blue Circle Voices" of the International Diabetes Federation.

4. What do you see as the opportunities for IAPO's role promoting patient-centred healthcare in the next 5 years? How do you see IAPO's role in helping the world recover from the COVID-19 pandemic and build back better?

The role of IAPO, like all non-profit organizations dedicated to health, will be transcendental, but they will also face great difficulties. On the one hand, they must refocus the objectives to include the inescapable reality that the coronavirus imposed, in a new scenario with new rules in an aggiornated agenda that makes sense in this crisis. Undoubtedly in this New Order, where the day after is not clear, IAPO has the opportunity to reaffirm what strengthens it and those battles that it has already fought and is to strengthen its members and transform them into a collaborative Community and more activist than ever to fulfill its objective of focusing attention on the Patient and achieving fairer, inclusive and equitable health for all. It will be essential for IAPO to seek new strategies to form networks, multisectoral alliances and thus achieve a more active participation in the decision-making processes of the countries and regions.

In relation to working together with other IAPO members, I can mention **#Consecuencias** (consequences), emerged as a movement to work on health problems. The main one, access to treatments and medicines for different diseases. It's made up of 5 women leaders from 6 Patient Associations (most of them are members of IAPO) who come together to give visibility to this problem and precisely to show all the **#Consecuencias** and put the various health issues on the agenda. Our idea is to energize the gears constituted by the State, health providers and Patients. We presented 10 proposals that aim to find solutions with a collaborative dialogue between Patient Associations and governments.
